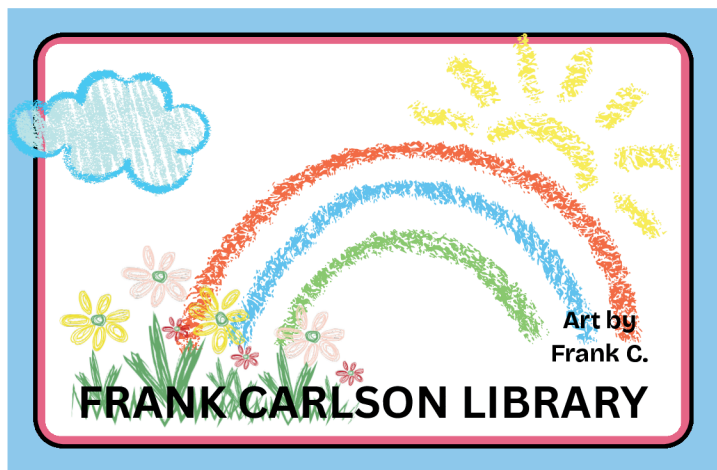

Bleed Area - non-white artwork shall extend beyond edge of card.

Below is space for your library card design. This space is twice the size of the final product. Some smaller details may be lost when resized.

To get the most out of your artwork, keep text or key art away from the edge to avoid having it cut off.

But, if you have a background color or design and want to go all the way to the edge of the card, take it all the way to the blue border for the best effect.

If you would like to submit digital artwork or photography, please contact the library for alternative submission.

The Library's logo will be placed at the bottom of the card. This is indicated by the two brackets on the outside of the drawing space. We will also add the first name and first initial of the last name of the artist to the card front.
